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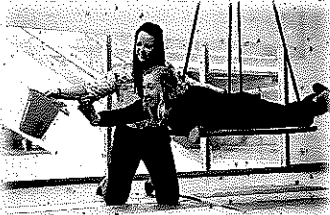


Occupational Therapy

What is an Occupation?

An **occupation** is any meaningful, goal-directed, or purposeful activity.

Examples of occupations: getting dressed, driving, eating, socializing, doing school work, playing a sport, combing hair, working, cleaning the house, mowing the lawn, singing, writing, shopping...



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What do Occupational Therapists do?

*They help people **improve their abilities** to participate in meaningful occupations.

*Help people **adapt the way they perform** meaningful occupations.

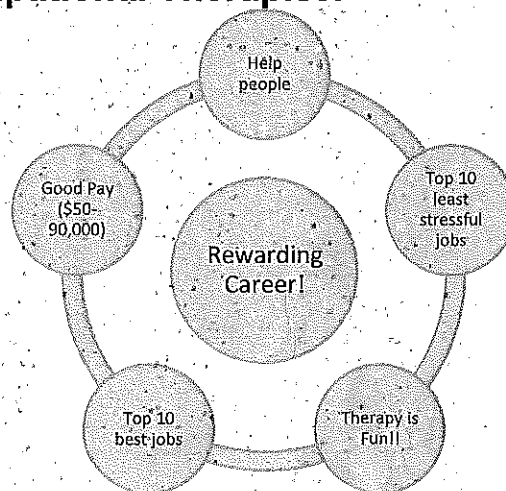

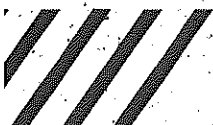
Why become an Occupational Therapist?
