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You will create a final research proposal to propose your research study. This is NOT a research paper - a research proposal is different from a research paper. This may seem overwhelming; however, all of the parts of this assignment will be created over several weeks within the course. You should save all materials you submit for the class and any notes/feedback you receive, and use that to revise the parts of your proposal.

This paper will require you to use in-text citations for anything that is paraphrased or quoted from another article (for additional help with in-text citations and references for the reference page at the end of the paper, please visit: <https://owl.english.purdue.edu/owl/section/2/10/>).

Papers are checked for plagiarism. Keep in mind, plagiarism can include: paraphrasing/quoting and not using in-text citations, quoting full paragraphs; your paper consisting of mostly quotes from other articles; or your paper directly mimicking another existing study.

All papers should be 3-5 pages in length, but there is no limit to how long it can be. For more information on the formatting of the paper, please review the Sample Paper, and other resources from Week 1, or feel free to email me any specific questions you may have.
