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Discussion Board Rubric

Overview:

The following discussion rubric is for this course only.

You must write original responses "posts" that thoroughly answer the questions. You will use examples and references to support your opinions. You need to write your response to the discussion by Wednesday and participate in the discussion on at least two days of the week. Try to make your required replies to others before Sunday to earn full participation points for that and give others time to respond. You are encouraged to log into the discussion throughout the week. Please feel free to contribute to the conversation more than the minimum number of times.

Instructions:

Study the rubric to understand how you will be graded on your discussion post.

Requirements:

Most of a post must be written in your own words. If you quote or paraphrase, you must say where you got the information and use quotations marks. Provide the web link when referencing an online resource, including videos or articles. You will not receive credit if you reference a source without citation. Use the grammar and spelling tools to proof your work before you post. Your initial response needs to be at least 8-10 sentences. Responses to others do not have a length requirement, but they need to be long enough to make a strong statement and meet the requirements outlined in the rubric.

Discussions occur during the current unit. If you do not participate during the unit, you cannot make up the discussion. However, you are expected to respond with an initial reply for partial credit.
