1. The Visual Elements of Art

- Line
 - Actual lines, implied lines, psychological lines
 - Horizontal lines, vertical lines, diagonal lines
 - Outlines or contour lines
 - Crosshatch, stippling or hatching
- Shape
 - What is distinguishing the shapes? Value, texture or color?
 - Shape, value, form, volume, mass (actual or implied)
 - Geometric - curvilinear or rectilinear - organic, nonobjective, abstract, amorphous
 - Figure, ground, positive shape, negative shape, figure-ground reversal
- Value
 - Achromatic grays, chromatic grays, Low key value range, high key value range, value contrast
 - Chiaroscuro vs. Tenebrism
- Color
 - Primary colors, secondary colors, tertiary colors
 - Hue, Value and Intensity; tint, shade and tone
 - High key colors vs low key colors; light reflection vs absorption
 - Warm, neutral and cool colors
 - Monochromatic, analogous and complementary color schemes
 - Local color, optical color and arbitrary color

- Texture
 - Actual texture and visual texture
 - Invented texture and subversive texture
 - Pattern
- Space
 - Actual vs illusional space (relative size, overlapping, vertical positioning, atmospheric perspective, linear perspective - one, two, twisted or multiple points)
- Time - implied time
- Motion - actual motion vs implied motion (multiplication of images, blurred lines, optical sensations)

2. The Principles of Design

- Unity
 - The grid, proximity, repetition, color and value, line
- Variety
- Emphasis
- Focal Point -
 - Directional lines, color or value contrast, placement
 - Static vs activated objects or figures
- Balance
 - Balance and imbalance
 - Actual balance vs visual balance
 - Pure/formal symmetry, approximate symmetry, asymmetrical balance, horizontal balance, vertical balance, diagonal balance, radial balance
- Rhythm - Regular, alternative or progressive
- Scale - Relative size, Hierarchical size, distortion of scale
- Proportion - true to life, exaggerated, etc.
- Composition - circular, triangle, the golden rectangle, the golden spiral, the root five rectangle
