

Module Five Collection of Sources Guidelines and Rubric

Overview

In this assignment, you will create a collection of secondary sources in preparation for your project, a proposal for a museum exhibit of sources will help you find, analyze, and understand the context of historical information. Taking this step to briefly summarize eac ensure you have collected credible sources that will support your ideas. Sometimes this step is called creating an annotated bibliogra annotation.

Directions

First, review the Project Guidelines and Rubric in the Supporting Material section. Next, locate five secondary sources that will provi include sources from the module resources section and your independent research.

Then, create annotations for each of the five secondary sources. Each annotation will summarize the source, evaluate the source's cr relevant to the historical event or subject you chose for your project. Refer to the APA Style Guide for details on how to provide a cir For each source, include the following:

- 1. Provide a full **citation** of the source.
 - a. Create an APA Style citation that would appear on a References list.
- 2. Briefly **summarize** the source.
 - a. What is the main idea?
 - b. What are two to three key points?
- 3. Evaluate the **credibility** of the source.
 - a. Use the SIFT method to "Investigate the Source."
 - i. Who wrote it?
 - ii. When was it published?
 - iii. What organization published it?

- b. Explain why this author, publication date, and publishing organization makes the source credible.
- 4. Describe any **biases** in the source.
 - a. What cultural bias or personal bias is presented?
 - b. What examples of confirmation bias exist?
- 5. Explain the **relevance** to the topic.
 - a. How does the source relate to the historic event?
 - b. How does the source provide evidence for any of the artifacts included in the exhibit?



| Bias | Describes blases in each source | Shows progress toward proficiency, but with errors or omissions; areas for improvement may include details about the presence of bias in each source | Does |

| Relevance | Describes the relevance to the topic | Shows progress toward proficiency, but with errors or omissions; areas for improvement may include details describing relevance, or ensuring that sources are more directly related to the event | Does |
| Clear Communication | Consistently and effectively communicates in an organized way to a specific audience | Shows progress towards proficiency, but communication is inconsistent or ineffective in a way that negatively impacts understanding | Shows or org |



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
