#### **Statement/Thesis:**

- Develop your ideas based on the key concepts from your article summaries. Make sure to reflect these ideas in your paper's introduction.

#### **• Create an Outline:**

- Organize your main points and supporting arguments in a logical order. This outline will serve as a roadmap for your writing.
- Include the key ideas from the articles and how they will be used to support your argument.

#### **1. Begin Writing:**

- Follow your outline to start writing the body of your paper. Each section should have a clear purpose and contribute to your overall argument.
- Back up your claims with evidence from the articles or research. Be sure to refer to the authors when discussing their ideas.

- Write a conclusion that clearly summarizes the argument, highlighting the main points you've made. It should be at least 3-4 sentences long.



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
