Guide to Test Essay #1: A Sensory Childhood

Come up with a **title** that is something more specific than "Childhood."

To begin your introduction, use a hook technique to grab your reader's attention. Narrow the focus of your essay.

The last sentence in your introduction should be a **thesis statement**. Choose one of the following thesis statements to guide your essay:

a

Childhood smells like,, and
Childhood tastes like,, and
Childhood sounds like,, and
You will only use <u>ONE</u> sense for the entire essay (DO NOT use smell for a paragraph, taste for paragraph, and sound for a paragraph.)
Then, you can use your 3-part thesis statement to guide you through the rest of your essay.
