 - How do light and shadow add to its dimensional properties?
 - Is this sculpture an example of a "closed" or an "opencomposition"?
 - How does the sculpture suggest motion? or is it static?
- How does the artists' choice of materials contribute to the viewer's experience?
- What is the subject matter of the program?
 - How does the subject matter connect to points mentioned above?
- How does the sculpture reflect the style of
 - The artist?
 - The patron?
 - The period in which it was made?
